Getting to Know One Another

- When it comes to patience those closest to me would say I have: lots, little, or none.
- What is one thing in your life that Jesus has used to teach you to be more patient?
- What is one thing you are or have been waiting on the Lord for?

Be still before the LORD and wait **patiently** for him; do not fret when people succeed in their ways, when they carry out their wicked schemes. **Psalm 37:37**

A hot-tempered person stirs up conflict, but the one who is **patient** calms a quarrel. **Proverbs 15:18**

Better a **patient** person than a warrior, one with self-control than one who takes a city. **Proverbs 16:32**

Through patience a ruler can be persuaded, and a gentle tongue can break a bone. **Proverbs 25:15**

The end of a matter is better than its beginning, and patience is better than pride. **Ecclesiastes 7:8**

12 Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. **13** Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. **14** And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity. **Colossians 3:12-14**

PATIENCE

If you are always in a hurry, people are not going to feel as though they are very **important** to you.

Patience is one of the **foundational** building blocks of LOVE.

5 Practical Steps to Slowing Your Stride

- 1. When people showed up I set aside what I was doing!
- 2. I took off my watch.
- 3. I gave people focused attention!
- 4. I decided I would not be in a hurry.
- 5. The side benefit of patience. When you are not in a hurry, the **Holy Spirit** almost always shows up in a very unique way.

[Patience in Suffering] Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, **patiently** waiting for the autumn and spring rains. **James 5:7**

You too, be patient and stand firm, because the Lord's coming is near. James 5:8
